October 13, 2020

The Winchester City Council met electronically in regular session Tuesday, October 13, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.

Mayor Harrell called the meeting to order beginning with Quarterly Reports by Winchester Utility Manager Roger Caldwell and Winchester Airport Manager Zachary Colescott.

In the first order of unfinished business, Councilman Cagley made a motion to approve the September 8, 2020 Council Minutes, Councilman Womack seconded the motion and the motion passed with the following roll call vote:

Next, City Administrator Beth Rhoton read Ordinance #1028, an ordinance amending Ordinance #506 known as the Zoning Ordinance of Winchester, Tennessee to rezone property on Cowan Highway and Halfmoon Road to C2, Commercial Highway Service District and C2A, Commercial Highway Service Alternative District from the current classification of C4, Multi Residential and Commercial District. Councilman Womack made a motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance #1028, Councilman Spencer seconded the motion and the motion passed with the following roll call vote:
